Imperial County - Limited child care funding is available for Imperial County residents who have children birth to thirteen (13) years of age and are considered "Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers." The definition of "essential workers" can be found [here](#).

Child care services will be provided through June 30, 2020, or until the State of Emergency has ended, whichever occurs first.

Eligible parents/guardians may select a child care provider or visit the Resource and Referral Online Database for a listing of available child care providers in the county at www.icoe.org/rr.

Essential workers that need childcare must apply for Emergency Childcare by completing the 1) COVID-19 2020 Confidential Application for Emergency Childcare Services, 2) COVID-19 Self-Certification document, 3) Child Care Provider Selection Form, and 4) Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification Form (W-9). These forms can be located at www.icoe.org/ecep/ap. This will be the only documentation required in order to certify the family for services.

The forms can be returned via fax, email, or drop off box.
